that I Thomas Crawford Judge of
the County of the County aforesaid
By virtue of the power and authority
in me vested by an act of the general
assembly of the state aforesaid
entitled an act to authorize the County
Court of Bibb County to appoint some
person to transcribe certain records of
said Court and for other purposes
approved December the 25th 1824 have
appointed and do hereby appoint
Williams Caddell Clerk of the County
Court to transcribe the minutes and
proceedings of the Commissioners Court
of roads and revenue from the commence-
ment of said Court under its present
organization up to this time and to
enter the same at length in this book
according to the true intent and mean-
ing of the act of the general assembly
aforesaid.
